

What was your inspiration for writing this book?

My inspiration was my own kids. Ever since they were babies, my wife and I would read their children's Bibles to them, which they loved. But when the kids hit their preteen years, we started reading the actual Bible during our nightly devotional time. And suffice it to say, things went downhill pretty fast. The kids found the text dry. often difficult to understand, and they complained that they were bored. So I looked for a book that just told the stories in a concise. straightforward, and entertaining way that was geared toward young people. When I couldn't find what I was looking for, I started writing the stories myself.

Is your book a teen Bible?

No. There are plenty of great Bibles on the market that have commentary for teens and young adults. This book doesn't just reprint the Bible text but tells the stories in a way that draws the reader in by bringing the characters to life. It does that by interjecting dialogue and often sharing what the characters likely were thinking and feeling as the amazing events chronicled in the Bible unfolded before their eyes. In that way, the reader will see that the characters in the Bible were not just two-dimensional historical figures, but real people with the same feelings, anxieties, hopes, and dreams that we all share.

How does your book bring the Bible's characters to life?

There are several chapters that are written as Peter's private diary. In those chapters, Peter opens up about things like his first impressions of Jesus. And how Christ made such an immediate impact on him that it caused him to give up his life as a fisherman and follow this guy, who he had just met. Or, in another diary entry, Peter describes the utter torment he felt after denying Jesus, the night Christ was arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane.
